Enabling strategies

Position Carers Australia as the advocacy leader for Carers ensuring that the diverse Carer voice is evident in national government policy.

Profile Carers Australia, as a federated body, with a Communication Strategy that supports Member Organisations' key messages.

Position Carers Australia to be the Carer voice for Older Persons (65yrs +), people with a disability (0 – 65), Mental Health, early childhood and end-of-life.

Influence government policy relating to early childhood and end of life where directly or indirectly affecting Carers.* There is strong community awareness and recognition of the diversity in carer roles and carers in diverse communities

Enabling strategies

Build community engagement and awareness that recognises and targets the diversity of carer roles and Carers in all communities across Australia.

Empower carer voices by maintaining a dialogue in communities that identifies, supports, and respects Carers, aligned with Member Organisations.

Engage Carers, communities, governments, and forpurpose organisations via the Carer Network to enhance understanding of carer issues using a focused communication strategy. needs nationally

Enabling strategies

Influence the direction and allocation of research funds that will strengthen the evidence base to support carer needs.

Provide leadership in the co-ordination and dissemination of carer research funds.

Conduct research to support carer needs that complements Member Organisations, if required. sustainable organisation

Enabling strategies

Engage and collaborate with member organisations to become a trusted partner.

Investigate alternative revenue streams from government, for-purpose, and philanthropic sectors and/or other ethical and aligned sources.

Focus on effective governance and strategic planning.

Explore partnership opportunities with national and international peak bodies and think tanks, philanthropic organisations and with individual Members on identified and agreed opportunities

About carers: A carer is any individual who provides care and support to a family member or friend who has a disability, mental illness, drug and/or alcohol dependency, chronic condition, terminal illness or who is frail. Carers are distinct from paid support workers who are often also called carers but are fully employed and remunerated with all the benefits of employment. Conversely, family and friend carers perform their caring duties without remuneration.
